

Dr. Eduardo Crivelli



Born in Buenos Aires in 1944. Graduated in the Facultad de Ciencias Económicas (1968) and the Facultad de Filosofía y Letras (1978), both at the Universidad de Buenos Aires. Doctorated in Anthropological Sciences at the same University in 1999. Professor of Old World Prehistory in the Facultad de Filosofía y Letras at the Universidad de Buenos Aires until his retirement in 2014.

From 1992 to 1996 was also Professor in the Universidad del Museo Social Argentino. From 1977 to 1992, he took part in the projects of archaeological rescue carried out by the University of Buenos Aires in the Limay River basin. In this same area he directed projects financed by the Conicet, the Foncyt and the Ubacyt until 2017. Crivelli belongs to the Argentine Archaeological Mission in Tell el-Ghaba, Egypt, where he was field director between 1995 and 2009. He also is member of the Ciafic (Buenos Aires), the Spanish Archaeological Mission in Turkey and the Spanish Association of Orientalists. From 2006, he is Associated Member of the International Institute of Prehistoric Research of the University of Cantabria, Spain.

Crivelli was appointed Académico Titular of the Academia Nacional de Ciencias de Buenos Aires, occupying the chair of J.B. Ambrosetti. At the Academy, he is a member of the Centro de Investigación y Desarrollo “Dr. Amílcar Argüelles”.

Crivelli received awards from the Universidad Complutense de Madrid, the Universidad de Buenos Aires and the Coloquio Binacional Argentino-Peruano.

He published 138 contributions, mainly on the archaeology of the Limay River basin and on Egypt.

Currently, he directs the study of the archaeological localities Cañadón Las Coloradas 1, Nestares, Fta Miche, Epullán Grande and Epullán Chica (Provinces of Río Negro and Neuquén, Patagonia).
